Review of Budget and Time Frame (Sally presented update) please refer to handouts of the meeting.

- All projects on going.
- Need to prioritize as soon as possible which species to tackle first on item 2B of the handout. The following two species are of interest:
 - Arbutus
 - □ Birch native (contaminated by introduced species)
- Need a one-day workshop with literature reviews on considered species.
- Could attract federal dollars to this work.

Ideal project works would be to tag cataloguing genes with scientific studies/questions on the species, then they both get done.

- Some of these are insect pollinated—Prunus, Cornus, Arbutus.
- different pollination dynamics to look at

Action:

Should have a background seed collection program to support any work required.

- Bank
- To deal with periodicity (Seed Centre).
- To deal with seed quality and testing (Seed Centre).
- Seed Collectors—Imperative to the program.
- · Genecology studies require a technician.

We have \$20,000 this year for collections.

Action:

Develop a plan of what FGC Centre does and role of MoF in this program.

- Develop a strategy and in that create roles and responsibilities.
- Centre—Collects and distributes information with recommendations for actions of in-site and ex-site.
- Where do recommendations go? To be addressed?

Issue—Where do project needs get done?

- There could be Gene Conservation Projects that will require a structure like ETAC committee to be done.
 - Field component of conservation programs, i.e., Whitebark pine plantation requirements.
 - · Long-term care of plantations and follow-up.
 - data
 - measurement and maintenance
 - analysis
- Need to get monitoring of plantations in-site areas (Parks, etc.) are the species regenerating, are populations still healthy?

Action: Get strategy in place.

□ Response to strategy: role of Tree Seed Centre and MoF with Gene Conservation Centre at UBC.

Justin Stead: Certification Needs of Genecology

FSC Process: Weyerhaeuser private dollars used for his two-year stint in Vancouver at UBC.

Global Initiatives for certification:

- What has been certified, i.e., Fletcher Challenge in New Zealand, Sweden—in family selection?
- What should be?
- Certification schemes?
- ****Paper on what should be considered in the genetics components of certification systems.

Staff for UBC Centre for EGC

- Propose to interview both candidates—Sara and Andreas.

Post-Doc from Brazil

- Scholarship of \$19,000—funding leveraged

Issue of species: Water dispersal pollination mechanisms are not as applicable as insect pollination→more applicable Dogwood or Arbutus.
